6.	Membership Secretary Report	
	At the end of October 2024, the IBC membership reached 155 members for the year – again. It has been encouraging to see many new faces amongst our club members.	AB/CM
	This was the fifth year that IBC ordered membership cards from 'Club Cards 121' which were ordered in three batches from the initial annual membership renewals. Beyond the third order date new member's cards were produced in-house as required, on an ad-hoc basis, throughout the year.	



	Club Cards 121 service this year was not to the high-quality standard we have received in the previous four years therefore after careful consideration and communication with cycling clubs in East Anglia - the club's committee have agreed to cease the production of membership cards on an annual basis.	
	Discussion has taken place with British Cycling to ensure the safety of our members is not altered, to ensure all members in the first instance receive the appropriate care should an unexpected incident or accident occur then we will contact their chosen emergency contact person.	
	All we ask of members is to ensure that they have an emergency number on the mobile phone contact listing named 'ICE'.	
	Moving on and adapting, we have seen how awkward it is for our members to renew their annual membership each year on New Year's Eve. Moving renewals for 2025 to March (meaning that 2024 was a bargain 15-month year) appears to be the time for many to consider their return to venturing outdoors on a regular basis. We hope this will be a more convenient time for our members to ensure that the process is swiftly completed each year going forward.	
	To confirm - members' current membership will be rolled forward to March 2025 following this meeting.	
	The British Cycling individual club membership system will remain as the IBC central membership recording facility as this links into events and competition entries for those members who either currently compete or may do so in the future.	
	We would still ask that members carefully check their details are correct on their British Cycling records particularly at the time of their BC renewal, (which is likely to be a different time of year from IBC renewal date) or at any time when there is a significant change such as a change of home address. BC membership is mandatory however we would suggest members familiarize themselves with the levels of BC membership as they have recently been revised.	
	We look forward to a busy March processing membership renewal (due March 2025) for our Club's membership into 2025.

<u>Off Road Social</u> – Mark Salter There have been a large number of off road social events taking place this year involving club members joining in with the Fuddy Muckers for a variety of off road disciplines. Among these have been mountain bikes and gravel bikes on various off road trails	MS
in Suffolk and further afield in Great Britain. There is no active mountain biking competition being run in the Eastern Region this year, but IBC have an active section of off-road mountain and gravel bikers who regularly meet on organised rides taking in a diverse set of off-road routes from country tracks and bridle ways, to canal tow paths and forest tracks. IBC has not renewed the corporate membership to Twisted Oaks as it wasn't being used by more than a handful of members.	
Several organised rides have taken place in Rendlesham, Tunstall and Thetford Forest as well as Alton Water.	
Media – Mark Salter Facebook has continued to be our main tool to communicate events and information to our members this year, followed up with email for those not using this form of social media. The website continues to present a face to the outside world and has encourage quite a few new people to get in touch with us about becoming members and joining in with our rides.	MS
Not so much use has been made of Twitter and Instagram this year so we are pleased to announce that Sue Chittock has volunteered to take on the role of media reporter so you will see more posts about IBC in the coming months promoting what we do.	
<u>Club Clothing</u> – Kevin Stark As members will be aware we moved back to Endura for club clothing this year. The new online 'shop' has opened twice and proved to be relatively straightforward. We decided to hold a selection of common items for sizing purposes, in order to provide some reassurance to members when trying to decide which size to buy, given the costs involved. This has proved a popular service.	кs
We do hold a small selection of items for sale which members may like to know about, these are men's Gilets (a useful way of still displaying club colours in the autumn/winter months) a limited number of Long Sleeve Jerseys, Arm Warmers and Socks.
